My dear Masani,

Thanks for your wire. Some friends are trying to persuade the Socialists to withdraw their amendment so that it would not be possible for the P.M. to claim that Parliament has refused to censure his acceptance of the proposals. If by any chance the Socialists were to press it to vote, all the other democratic groups have agreed to abstain from voting but I propose to consult our people again tomorrow and if they would agree we would vote for it to accommodate your strong views. The enclosed copy of my letter to Rajaji would give you other considerations in regard to this matter.

Raja of Ramgarh is coming to meet me tomorrow. He said that he left Delhi on the 11th itself and so did not get my wire addressed to Ashoka Hotel. Our Party gave him a tea in the same way as Dandekar and other leaders of the State Parties had been entertained. There was no discussion.

I have seen your memo to be presented on behalf of the C.O.C. On page 3, line 3, item 10, please add word "not" between words "have" and "been". Otherwise the statement is alright.
