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Sir,

You may recall that at the last Business Advisory Committee Meeting it was agreed that the consideration of the Monopolies Bill which was a controversial measure should not be left over till after the 18th instant as the Opposition Congress would be absent owing to their session in Ahmedabad on 19th and some others concerned with the Bill would be absent at the same time. It was therefore unanimously agreed that the Bill should be proceeded with without any interruption.

We are sorry to find that both today and tomorrow Other Business has been put on agenda from 3.30 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. respectively with the result that very little time has been left for proceeding with the Monopolies Bill.

I am writing, therefore, to request that care may please be taken to see that no other business is put on agenda on Wednesday the 17th and Thursday the 18th so that the further consideration of the Bill may be proceeded with without any interruption and concluded, if possible, by the 17th or by the 18th at the latest.
