Dear Mr. Bhagwati,

I write in continuation of my letter of April 10. I find that Mr. Piloo Mody is not likely to return to Bombay from tour for the next 5 or 6 days and since I am told that the matter should not be kept pending any further I have decided to draw lots in so far as the new Members of our Party in Parliament who have applied for bungalows are concerned.

2. According to the result of the lots, the remaining bungalows, after one has been allocated to Mr. N. Dandeker, should be given in the following order :

1. Mr. Mohamed Inam
2. Mr. Manu Amersey
3. Mr. Muthuswamy
4. Nawabzada Zulfiqar Ali Khan
5. Shri Meghrajji of Dhrangadhra
6. Mr. Viren Shah
7. Mr. Piloo Mody
8. Mr. Venkatappa Naik

3. I would like at this point to put to you certain considerations about the number of bungalows allotted to our Party. I understand that seven bungalows have been allotted to the Swatantra Group and that Mr. P. Mody is party to it. Since I do not wish to reopen something which has already been agreed we shall, therefore, assume that seven is the correct figure but we do not wish any of the bungalows already occupied by members of the Party or those allotted to members of our group without reference to us to be included in that number. Thus for instance, my own house at 57, Lodi Estate which was allotted to me as a former Ambassador by the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs and was not then part of the Parliamentary Pool, should not be taken into account. Similarly, if Mr. C.C. Desai is proposed to be given some house on Akbar Road it should be an addition to our group's allocation as you will see that his name is not in the results of the draw.

4. We would, therefore, request that at least six bungalows should be allocated after one has been allotted to Mr. Dandeker, in the order in which the names are listed in paragraph 2 above.
