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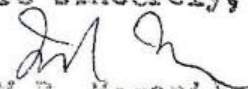
My dear Prime Minister,

The current session of Parliament will conclude on April 7, and, before it does so, the question of the opening date of the next session will have to be decided. The Executive Committee of my Party has discussed the question this morning and is of the view that the commencement of the next session may most advantageously be fixed for the first days of June. As you are aware, the vote on account covers four months - April, May, June and July - and the demands of the Government have, therefore, to be passed by 31st July. We believe that two months would be sufficient for this purpose.

The programme we suggest would have the advantage of allowing you and your colleagues in the Government to attend to the important tasks of administration and enable you to come before Parliament adequately prepared for the business of the next session.

I am writing to you in this connection in view of some press reports which have indicated a much earlier date for the beginning of the next session and which have caused us some concern.
