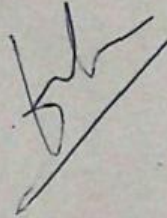

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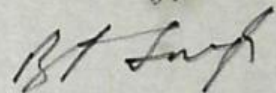


My dear Mr. Raju,

I have received your letter dated April 13, 1977. Please don't misunderstand me. Though I am now a member of the ruling party, I am prompt in replying letters. It seems that you have been writing letters to me at a wrong address. My address is 206, Vithalbhai Patel House, and not 531, as written in your last letter.

Though I was a member of the sub-committee to draft the Janata Party Constitution, I must confess, I did not take much interest in this work. In fact, instead of framing a new Constitution, attempt has been made only to make suitable amendments in the Cong-O party Constitution. The Cong-O leaders insisted that their Constitution was the best, and we have accepted the same only with necessary alterations. I did not take much interest, because I felt that the Constitution could be amended as and when required.
