Subject :- My letter dated 3rd September 1965.

On 3rd September last I sent a letter to you Sir, in connection with the theft of my regd. letter dated 20th Feb. 65, from the bungalow of the Union Home Minister Mr. G.L. Nanda, as well as the theft of my regd. letter dated 11th April, 65, from the office of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. I had expressly requested you Sir, to place my letter in the hands of Mr. G. L. Nanda, on the floor of the Lok Sabha. Yet, for some reason your good Sir saw it fit to send it to the office of the Ministry of Home Affairs by a peon, as a routine method, with the result that my letter was suppressed by Mr. Nanda's private secretaries, to hush up the theft of my previous letter of 20th Feb. 65, and Mr. Nanda remained ignorant about its presence in his office, because it was never placed before Mr. Nanda, like my previous letter of 20th Feb. 65, which was stolen without the knowledge of Mr. Nanda.

Twice Mr. Nanda's secretaries wrote me on different dates, that my regd. letter of 20th Feb. 65, had been sent to the Chief Minister of Maharashtra. On three different occasions I wrote letters to Mr. V.P. Naik the Chief Minister, in connection with my letter, which was supposed to have been sent from New Delhi to Mr. V.P. Naik. On each occasion my letter was suppressed by Mr. Naik's personal assistant Mr. S.V. Kiste, perhaps on the advice of Mr. Naik's private Secretaries, in collaboration with Mr. Nanda's private secretaries, and Mr. V.P. Naik never saw any of my three letters addressed to him. It comes to the conclusion that there is a conspiracy between Mr. Nanda's private secretaries and Mr. Naik's private secretaries to hush up my complaint, so that the two culprits, the I.G.P. of Bombay Mr. Saiyed Majeedullah, and the Director of the Central Bureau of Investigations Mr. D.P. Kohly may not come to grief by being suspended by Mr. G.L. Nanda.

I therefore appeal to you Sir, in the name of 'Democracy' to place this second letter of mine in the hands of Mr. G.L. Nanda, personally, so that Mr. Nanda may come to know as to what is going on in the office of the Ministry of Home Affairs, and what type of men his private secretaries are, and I expressly request you good Sir to help 'TRUTH PREVAIL' over 'Corruption'.

Subject:--- Theft of my letter dated 20th February 1965
addressed to the Union Home Minister Mr. G.L.Nanda
(sent by Regd. Post) from the bungalow of Mr.
G. L. Nanda.
Theft of yet another letter dated 11th April 1965
addressed to the Chief Justice of the Supreme
Court (sent by Regd. Post) from the office of
the Supreme Court.

Sir,

The Inspector General of Police of Bombay Mr. Saiyed Majeedullah is shielding and protecting a sadistic criminal and a homicidal maniac named Dr. Homi Shapurji Mehta (a retired police surgeon of Bombay) from Law and Justice. On the 20th February 1965 I wrote a letter to Union Home Minister Mr. G. L. Nanda, giving details of the sadistic crimes perpetrated by Dr. H.S.Mehta, and posted that letter by Regd. Post. Dr. Mehta is shadowing me with the help of hired agents, and one of them saw me posting the letter to Mr. Nanda. He immediately informed Dr. Mehta who in his turn brought the matter to the notice of Mr. Saiyed Majeedullah the I.G.P. Mr. Majeedullah picked up his phone in the Head Police Office, and called Director D.P. Kohly of the Central Bureau of Investigation, with whom he is on friendly terms, and requested Mr. Kohly to intercept my Regd. letter at Mr. Nanda's bungalow. On instructions from Mr. Kohly one of Mr. Nanda's private Secretaries (most probably Mr. J.C.Saxena) stole my registered letter on the same being delivered by the postman, without the knowledge of Mr. Nanda, and handed it over to Mr. Kohly. Mr. Kohly in his turn sent my registered letter back to Bombay, to his friend the corrupt Mr. Saiyed Majeedullah.

Again on the 11th April 1965, I wrote a letter to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, giving details of Dr. Mehta's sadistic crimes, and posted the letter on the 12th of April by Regd. Post. Again one of Dr. Mehta's hired agents saw me posting the letter to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and informed Dr. Mehta, and again Dr. Mehta brought the matter to the notice of Mr. Saiyed Majeedullah. For a second time within two months, Mr. Majeedullah called his friend Director D.P.Kohly on the long distance phone, and requested him to intercept my Regd. letter addressed to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. For a second time Director D.P.Kohly saw to it that my registered letter never reached its destination. When the registered acknowledgement form came back from Delhi, it bore the stamp of ' The Directorate of Supplies and Disposals ' instead of the office of the Supreme Court.

It is a matter of great shame that in a country which boasts of being a 'Sovereign Republic' a citizen cannot write a letter to the Home Minister or the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, without the same being stolen despite the fact that the letters were registered before being despatched. And who are the thieves ? None but very high officers of the Police Force ? If the theft of my letters is not a cognizable offence, then what it is ? Why these two officers of high rank should not be tried in the court of Laws ? If a corrupt I.G.P. like Jimmy Nagarwala can be suspended and charge sheeted by the Gujrat Government, then why cannot both Mr. Majeedullah and Mr. Kohly be suspended and tried for the cognizable offence of theft, from the bungalow of the Home Minister, and the office of the Supreme Court ?

Mr. G.L. Nanda is the President of the Sadachar Samiti, then let him find out what is happening in his own bungalow.

Mr. Hukum Singh, I am afraid, perhaps this letter itself will also be stolen, instead of being delivered to you. But I am sending copies of this letter to two very well known and respectable members of the Lok Sabha, so that they can verify, whether you received the original copy sent to you. I request you Sir, to place this letter in the hands of the Home Minister Mr. G.L.Nanda on the floor of the Lok Sabha, so that he may know what is going on behind his back.
