Kindly excuse me for this short reference in continuation of my registered letter dated 21.10.65 which has already reached you vide acknowledgement slip.

A copy of the Advocates (Amendment) Bill no. XIV sent up by the Union Law Ministry as said to have been introduced in the Rajya Sabha there on 24.9.1965 is re-enclosed for ready reference. The same has to come to the Lok-Sabha today or tomorrow.

This repetition is the result of the news read in the "Search-light" dated 27.10.1965 under heading "18 New Bills for Parliament" (copy of the Paper-cutting enclosed) which does not seem to include the Advocates (Amendment) Bill no. 14 introduced in the Rajya Sabha, on 24.9.1965 and hence to respectfully alert you to kindly look up. May be that the News paper refers only to the most important 18 items and there might be other bills also including the Advocates (Amendment) Bill referred to above. This is no doubt a matter for verification.

While earnestly requesting and repeating to kindly see that the Bill concerning us for which you took so much trouble and interest since December last, may be passed by you Hon'ble members in the Lok Sabha in the present-session, I may be excused for repeated letters and causing botheration.

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6. In Section 24 of the Principal Act in clause (a) of Sub-section (3) the words, figures and letters "before the 31st day of March, 1964 and "then in force" shall be omitted.

18 NEW BILLS FOR PARLIAMENT

NEW DELHI Oct. 26 (UNI) : Eighteen new legislative measures have been included in the agenda of the winter session of Parliament beginning here on November 3.

The most important of them are three measures aimed at implementing the recommendations of the fourth Finance Commission. They are : The additional Duties of Excise (goods of special importance) Amendment Bill, the Estate Duty (Distribution) Bill, the Union Duties of Excise (Distribution) Bill.

Parliament will discuss bills amending the provisions of the Foreign Exchange Regulations Act and constituting a separate High Court for Delhi.

The Indian Official Secrets (Amendment) Bill, making all offences under the Act cognisable and non-bailable will also come up for consideration during the coming session.

Another measure, the criminal law amendment bill, confers jurisdiction on courts martial to try certain specified offences in respect of service personnel.

By another piece of legislation the Government proposes to empower itself to take action against individuals and associations on grounds of prejudice to public order, integrity and the sovereignty of the nation.

Another measures will extend certain Central acts to the State of Jammu and Kashmir.

Other important measures are : the Kandia Free Trade Zone Bill, the Companies (second) Amendment Bill, the Displaced Persons (compensation and rehabilitation) Amendment Bill and the Delhi Land Reforms (second amendment) Bill.

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
