My dear Bhanu Prasadjee,

Thank you for yours and the cutting from some Hindi paper. I am shocked to learn that any paper could have committed such a glaring and unpardonable misreporting.

All the English daily papers in Delhi, Bombay and Madras have reported so clearly that Ranga told the Conference and the P.M. that "he could not speak for the Swatantra Party, that the Swatantra Party has no view, that no party should take a party decision, that he could speak only for himself and the Prime Minister should call a conference of not only party leaders but also those in each party who take up the other view as well as educationists, students, leaders and try to reach a consensus. Anyhow our Party has no advice or instruction to give to our members, except they are free to hold any view they think useful to the country.

How can any one think that I can possibly make any such mistake as is attributed, so unconsciously to me by this paper. So please do give the tie direct to this false statement in some appropriate press statement of yours.
