My dear Masani,

Now that Gayatridevijee is unwilling to assure us that she would go to the Andhra Convention or Madras in June as we had understood earlier, I think it would be useful if you are good enough to reconsider your Whole programme and agree to fix some convenient date in the third or fourth week of May for the National Executive as well as for the Nellore Convention. Please be good enough to wire to me and also Latchanna as soon as you decide about this matter.

I learn that both P.K.Ghosh and Dr.B.N. Singh and possibly his mother and wife are willing to ask for associate membership of our Party in Parliament, so Mr. Mahida informs me. I have myself talked to P.K.Ghosh and he seems to me quite ready to ask for associate membership. He said that Dr.B.N.Singh had reminded him that after all they have not so far informed the Speaker of any change of their place in the Parliament.

I am afraid, however, that they may not be willing to offer any apology or express regret for their earlier letter to us in view of their unwillingness to develop any hard feelings with the Raja Sahib. So, if I am inclined to waive any such condition provided you do not mind it. I am informing these things in advance so that before coming to Delhi you may be able to negotiate with your own feelings and be agreeable to some reasonable formula for ensuring their membership on associate basis in the Parliamentary Group for whatever it is worth. In the meanwhile I am not making any promise to anybody.
