Dear Mr. Masani,

As desired by you I have already sent a copy of Members' Salaries & Allowances Bill, as pass by Lok Sabha, to Yuvraj Sahib of Rajkot with your compliments.

I am enclosing herewith for your kind perusal an Article entitled "a brief but tragic Session" published in Hindu of June 11, 1964. I invite your attention to the last paragraph of the article wherein Hindu's special Correspondent, the author of the article, ridicules the performance of our Group in the Rajya Sabha on the Constitution 17th Amendment Bill. As desired by the Parliamentary Board, our members in the Rajya Sabha should have at the introduction stage staged a walk-out. But they did not and Hindu has taken an exception to that. Moreover, the correspondent also ~~emphasize~~ on the presence of only 7 members of our Party at the time of ~~the~~ voting in Rajya Sabha.

Prof. Ranga has suggested that we should bring out a Brochure regarding Swatantra's fight to the Constitution 17th Amendment Bill. You also mentioned about this in our Party Meeting held on the 2nd June 1964. May I suggest in this connection we ~~should~~ send a circular letter to all our State units requesting them to send us material on the subject for inclusion in our proposed brochure. The brochure, as suggested by Prof. Ranga, will include all articles written on the subject by Rajaji, Prof. Ranga, yourself and other leaders, speeches delivered inside and outside the Parliament, Resolutions passed etc.
