Order of preference

\* Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

- a) Whether it is a fact that the Dearness Allowance which was being paid to Central Government employees posted in the former State of Bombay was higher than that paid to the State Government employees before the recommendations of the 2nd Pay Commission;
- b) If so, whether any increase was effected in Dearness Allowance paid by the two State Governments after the bifurcation of the State into Maharashtra and Gujerat;
- c) If so, the details thereof; and
- d) Whether there was any difference in regard to the dates from which the increase was effected by the two States, and why?

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\* Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

- a) Whether there have been frequent complaints from the Central Government employees posted in Gujarat that the State Government has not so far implemented most of the recommendations of the 2nd Pay Commission;
- b) What was the time limit specified for the purpose by the Pay Commission; and
- c) What steps have been and are being taken by the Government of India to get the grievances of the employees concerned redressed?

- a) The nature of the recommendations of the 2nd Pay Commission in regard to Central Government employees posted outside Delhi;
- b) Whether any time limit was specified by the Pay Commission for implementing their recommendations;
- c) Whether those recommendations have been implemented by all State Governments; and,
- d) If not, what steps have been and are being taken by the Central Government to see that those recommendations are given effect to expeditiously by the defaulting State Governments?
