Dear Sir,

'Namastey'.

My father Sri Gouthu Latchanna, who is under detention since 26th June, 1975 is now an inpatient, Osmania General Hospital, Hyderabad.

As I am allowed officially under rule 24 of the Andhra Pradesh Preventive Detention (Regulation of Place and Conditions) Order, 1969, to attend on my father during his stay at the hospital, I am enclosing herewith (1) a copy of the notice issued by the Supreme Court of India, New Delhi addressed to the respondents ~~xxx~~ on the criminal appeal No.414 of 1976, filed by my father (which was received by my father only on 25th November, 1976) and (2) a copy of the letter confirming the telegram sent on 29-11-1976 to the Registrar of the Supreme Court by my father for your information.

Inspite of the telegraphic prayer in the above said enclosed letter, we are afraid that the Supreme Court may not agree to direct the respondent to produce my father before the Court or even to adjourn the case.

Some of ~~the~~ our advocate friends at Hyderabad are of strong opinion that if eminent senior advocate like Shri Palkivala takes this opportunity by appearing in this case could do a great service to the Nation as a whole by enlightening at least the intellectual public of our country and already by his effective and justifiable argument explaining in detail the great injustice caused to a citizen and particularly to the justice by the latest judgement of the Supreme Court declaring that a person detained under Maintenance of Internal Security Act cannot file a writ.

May, we, therefore, request you kindly to represent this matter to Shri Masani on our behalf and see suitable action is taken at Supreme Court on 6th December, 76, so as to get the adjournment and then to arrange a eminent senior advocate to appear on behalf of my father.

We will be very much obliged if you kindly inform to the above address about the action taken.
