My dear Raju,

Many thanks for your letter of 29th April 1976 enclosing the letter of Sri Girish Munshi and a copy of your note to him on the demand from the Income-tax authorities.

Some of us here like our President, Mr. G.K. Sundaram and myself felt that we should hold the meeting of the National Executive to discuss current political developments especially the minutes of a meeting of some opposition parties that you were so good to send me sometime back and take appropriate decision after discussion. I also think that our committee should consider the proposals for damaging the Constitution further and express itself vigorously and in full on this important subject. ~~We have to discuss and take a decision about the efforts of some of the opposition parties to join together and make our stand clear to all concerned.~~ Mr. G.K. Sundaram thought a central place like Bombay will be more convenient for members to assemble in larger numbers and participate in the vital discussions. We may have also the advantage of meeting Mr. J.P. and have the participation of Mr. Masani also in our discussions. Since Mr. Munshi will be returning to Bombay only after 2nd June 1976 and as Mr. Masani also is out of India I think we can have the meeting in the second week of June, if it is convenient to all of you in Bombay. Kindly contact Sri Kejriwalji and Sri Munshi and let me know your joint decision so that I may inform all the members much in advance about the proposal to have the meeting in Bombay in the second week of June. We may also prepare draft resolutions and send them in advance for consideration of the members.

Regarding the income-tax matter I shall consult our President and act according to his instructions. You may kindly send the income-tax notice, if available with you for proceeding further in

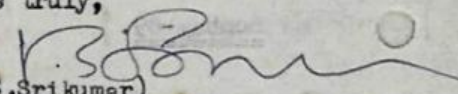
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the matter.
