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Dear friend,

In view of the forthcoming meeting of the National Coordination Committee on 14th April, we wish to invite your attention to the following:

Although the convention of various political Parties and individuals on November 25-26, had decided to launch struggles in various states as also to to organise Jan Sangharsh ~~Samitis~~ Samanvaya Samitis for the purpose, the present position in respect of both these decisions is depressing.

Even though state level samitis have been formed in UP, Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Punjab, M.P., J&J, Gujarat and Orissa, in most cases they are not active. Not only have they not given thought to the setting up lower level samitis with a view to ultimately making the entire structure genuine representative of the people from village upwards, they have failed even to chalk out concrete forms of struggle. The only exception to this is U.P. where districts/ level committees are being formed, and a programme of Satyagrahas has also been finalised. In most other cases, even the decision to hold state level demonstrations has not been followed. In the Punjab, the position is that the call to observe anti emergency day on 6th April has found no response from the State Jan Sangharsh Samiti. In Delhi, the call was first received enthusiastically, and it was announced that over a thousand will take part in the dharna involving defiance of section 144, but ultimately the decision was watered down to this extent that only a dozen leaders will defy the ban, if need be.

It appears to us that although the conditions in the country are deteriorating fast, and the ruling party and its ally, the CPI, are taking recourse to the most deplorable means, this fact is not registering with the lower rungs of party organisations. Even when the people are extremely troubled and restless, their leaders at various levels appear unprepared to lead them.

Whatever be the reasons for the hesitation on behalf of those concerned to launch struggles in various States, we believe that time has come when the National Coordination Committee must think not in terms of gradually extending the people's movement to this state and the next, nor leave the timing etc. of such struggles to state level political parties, but do something to harness the people's readiness to participate in mass actions in the particular background of the happenings in Orissa and Calcutta and the Government's persistent refusal to hold elections in Gujarat inspite of Morarji Bhai's fast, which are indicative of the trend of thought in the ruling party.

It is therefore our submission that this meeting should give a call

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for nationwide civil disobedience movement to start in not more than six weeks's time on the issues framed in the People's Charter. During the intervening period, national leaders of various parties and other eminent publicmen will have to undertake extensive tours for preparing the people for this great battle. These leaders will also have to initiate the struggles by offering arrests.

One reason why a C.D. movement is urgently called for is that as time passes, the attention of political parties is shifting away from the struggle on to election preparations. This is indeed a piquant situation that while there is no certainty of the holding of the elections, we are busy preparing for them; even though one does not know whether they will be free and fair if held.

We earnestly hope that you will take all the factors into serious consideration, and agree to our proposal. This, in our view, would alter the present situation basically in favour of the people's power.
