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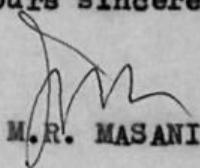
Dear Mr. Sinha,

This morning a member of your staff came to deliver to me notice No. REV/EVT/A-397/85 of 23.8.1985. As you will notice, this notice to me was over a year and a half outdated. Secondly, car No. MRG 2347 never belonged to me. This has been explained to the Regional Transport Officer by my letter of 18th February 1986 which refers to the previous occasions on which I have repeatedly written to the R.T.O. stating that the bill is in respect of this jeep and other jeeps, which belonged to the Swatantra Party and were sold by the Party in 1967 and that the bill should not be sent to me any more. I requested that I should be spared the harrassment of having to reply repeatedly to such uncalled for notices. A copy of my letter to the Regional Transport Officer dated 18th February 1986 is enclosed for your information.

In view of this will you kindly return the papers to the R.T.O. and ask him not to create needless work for your office and for me ?
