The Minutes of the previous meeting were confirmed and signed.

Mr. M. Bhimani had agreed to serve on this Committee. Mr. Mendieta was out of Bombay, and no reply had been received from him.

As no action had been taken on Mr. Murarji Vaidya's offer of premises for a Labour Contact Centre by reason of the difficulty in providing adequate supervision, Mr. Vaidya undertook to provide a supervisor also.

It was agreed that Convenors' Reports should be put on the table two days before the meetings of the Committee, and only brief oral summaries be given at the meetings.

The sub-committee appointed to select a paid executive secretary recommended the appointment of Mr. M. Mehta, on probation for six months from 1st November, 1959, on a salary of Rs.700/- a month. The recommendation was accepted. A clear definition of his functions was suggested by Sir H. P. Mody and the Chairman said that he would prepare a memorandum of instructions for the executive secretary, who would work under the guidance of the Committee and the office-bearers.

It was agreed that a monthly report of Bombay activities be sent, as requested, to Mr. Krishnaswamy.

The proposal for a Youth Contact Centre to be run by volunteers from the Ladies' Committee was discussed and

welcomed, though it was felt that an Employment Bureau would not be appropriate. Sir H. P. Mody was requested to discuss the matter with the Ladies' Committee and report to the Committee.
