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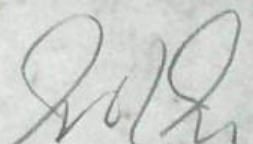

My dear Rajaji,

I have not received any reply to my letter to you of November 2. I have been discussing the possibility of holding the Organisation Sub-Committee meeting in Delhi on 23 and 24 November when you will be there. Munshi has to leave for Mathura on the 24th morning. He has agreed to join us for discussion on the 23rd ~~and in the~~ morning of the 24th. Since Paliwal is no longer a member of the Organisation Sub-Committee, the only additional person who would be there, if a formal meeting was called, would be Ramgarh. Munshi and I feel that it would be better not to call a formal meeting but to have informal discussions between the four of us and in the event of approval of the Organisation Sub-Committee being formally required to any decisions, we would circularise our conclusions and get their formal approval by the Organisation Sub-Committee. We think we shall get very much further by discussions of this nature than by a formal meeting which would converted into a squabble over the Jeep Credit and the quarrels in Bihar between the President on the one hand and the General Secretary (Sardar Harihar Singh) and the Vice-President (Mr. Ram Binod Singh) on the other, who ~~are~~ appointed by the Organisation Sub-Committee meeting in Bombay on the approval of the State President himself. In view of this, I am not issuing formal notices of a Organisation Sub-Committee meeting. Munshi and I would appreciate if you can keep time free on the 23rd and the morning of the 24th for serious discussions about the Party between ourselves.
