MOTION ON ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT

SHRI TRIDIB KUMAR CHAUDHURI :—

1. That at the end of the motion, the following be added, namely :—
“but regret that in the Address there is no mention of the indescribably sad and miserable plight into which nearly 10 million goldsmiths, gold ornaments workers and smithy artisans has been thrown suddenly due to the enforcement of restrictions on the making of ornaments having gold of a purity above 14 carats”.
2. That at the end of the motion, the following be added, namely :—
“but regret that in the Address no steps have been suggested to curb the political activities of reactionary vested interests in the country who are trying their best in league with foreign imperialists to undermine the national policy of non-alignment with power blocs and the national defence efforts in the present emergency through open pernicious propaganda in press and public platforms”.

3. That at the end of the motion, the following be added, namely :—

 - (d) the imperative need to enhance and accelerate, inspite of the present emergency, welfare programmes for the socially and economically backward sections of our population, specially the Scheduled tribes and castes to narrow down within a reasonable period the existing disparity".
