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Dear Sir,

I have your telegram and letter of 18th January. Notice of the adjournment motion, as desired by you, could not be given as Shri Dharm Pal and others have already been released. Consequent to this development, adjournment motion could not be admitted.

Government has not moved any resolution in regard to the Colombo proposals. In consultation with other opposition leaders, we have decided not to move any amendment or to move any resolution in this regard. Prof. Ranga has already intimated you about the discussions he had with the opposition leaders on the subject.

A note on the Colombo proposals, which you sent to me, have been shown to our MPs. Prof. Ranga will open the debate on our behalf in the Lok Sabha followed by Shri P.K. Deo the subsequent day.

The book entitled "The Judiciary in Peril" have been passed on our Members of the Joint Select Committee on the Constitution (15th Amendment) Bill.
