Non-official motions for Parliament session ²⁵⁹

New Delhi, July 26 (PTI) — A Congress member's resolution urging the Government to appoint a committee to draw up a scheme of compulsory life insurance for every earning citizen of India has secured the first place in the ballot of non-official resolutions to be discussed by the Lok Sabha on Aug. 10. The Lok Sabha begins its monsoon session on Aug. 6.

The motion, tabled by Mr D. C. Sharma however, will be taken up after the House had disposed of a resolution partly discussed in the last session. The latter relates to ascertaining the representative character of a trade union by a secret ballot among workers.

Other resolutions which find a place in the ballot held today include one from Mr Anandan Nambiar (Comm.) who has suggested

the setting up of a commission to inquire into the progress made in regard to urban and rural housing and slum clearance schemes and another from Mr Krishnapal Singh (Swat.) calling for more amenities for third class passengers on railways.

Mr M. L. Dwivedi (Cong.) in another resolution has suggested that consumer co-operative stores should be organized for the benefit of Government employees in Delhi and other Union Territories.

Mr Prakash Vir Shastri (Ind.) has tabled a resolution calling for the resignation of the Central and State Governments six months before the general elections are held. Stabilization of prices of essential commodities has been urged in a resolution by Mr Rameshwar Tanti (Cong.).

The Lok Sabha devotes two and a half hours for the discussion of non-official business every Friday.

Motions for Rajya Sabha

The Rajya Sabha is expected to discuss on Aug. 10 a non-official resolution seeking enlargement of the scope of the third Plan to provide gainful employment to millions of unemployed persons within a reasonably short period.

The resolution, proposed by Mr R. S. Khandekar (PSP) says that the "fast deteriorating employment situation" in the country should be arrested.

Mr Khandekar's resolution has secured the first place in the ballot of non-official resolutions held today. The Rajya Sabha is reassembling on Aug. 6.

The second resolution set down for discussion is tabled by Mr Arjun Arora (Cong.) who has suggested that a parliamentary committee should be asked to inquire into and report on the growth of monopoly and concentration of ownership in the newspaper industry.

Other resolutions admitted for discussion include one from the Jan Sangh leader, Mr A. B. Vajpayee, who suggests that the Kashmir issue be withdrawn from the UN.

Mr Niranjan Singh (PSP) has in a resolution urged a survey to assess the removal of untouchability and the progress made by Harijans and other backward classes. Dr (Mrs) Seeta Parmanand has proposed legislation to settle the "boundary dispute" between Maharashtra and Mysore on the basis of the 'Pataskar Formula' applied in the case of Andhra Pradesh and Madras.
