Dear Shri Rangaji,

It is regrettable on my part to place the facts of this letter to your hand. However it is inevitable for me to do so both in the interest of the Party and in my own personal interest.

As I am not free these days to participate in the activities of certain Committees to which my name has been sponsored, I seek your kind permission to keep out myself from such Committees to which I request you to place some other colleague of our Party. The main reason for this is that I have to utilize all my leisure time to concentrate in my constituency for the constructive work as per the desire of our people in the constituency.

I am also not prepared to speak on any of the subjects that will be allotted to me from our Party excepting putting questions, Calling Attention Notices etc. in my own individual capacity without detriment to the Party's ideology and principles. But I will remain as a disciplined soldier of the party and will work for the interest of the Party. Please accept this request and make arrangements to liberate me from the responsibility of the Committees and the Parliamentary deliberations from the Party's ends in the Parliamentary Office.
