Dear Sir,

I am sure no-one needs to be convinced that Linguistic states have done great harm to India. It is also obvious that as long as Linguistic States are there, there is no hope of the progress of the Nation. Who can expect progress of a DIVIDED nation?

Obviously, we must abolish the Linguistic states and reorganise India into Non-Linguistic Zones. The Master Plan of Shri Mohan G. Advani is there; everyone supports it. This plan, when achieved, will certainly unite the Nation and will eradicate the evil done by the Linguistic States. There are no two opinions about it.

However, it is said, that Linguistic states have taken root for a long time now and many vested interests have sprung up. These vested interests may not allow India to be United. These vested interests may organise disturbances in the country by inciting linguistic feelings.

I do not contribute to this view. Nevertheless if there is a genuine fear about these vested interests obstructing the Unity of India, we have to find out exactly who they are, find out their names and addresses, and persuade them not to ruin the country for personal gain.
