Narayana Reddy was all admiration for you when I showed him your letter. He said the sentiments you had expressed could not have been put down better. No wonder Masam placed such implicit Confidence in your judgment and efficiency.

In 1966 when there was a vacancy due to H. P. Menon's sad demise, I recommended to Masam that Ganapathi should be taken to the G. C. in that vacancy. It was done.

My dear Mr. Sreenivasan,

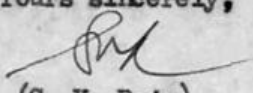
Enclosed is a copy of our letter to Mr. Ghorpade forwarding two cheques totalling Rs.1,357.16 as per the bills sent by you.
