My dear Ranga,

I enclose a copy of a letter that I have written to Rajaji, this being the only one that I have written since we met in Delhi. You will see from this that it looks as if Rangarh is already thinking of backing out of the undertaking he gave you about carrying out the Madras decision before the General Council meeting. He told me yesterday that he is going to be in Calcutta till the 5th and he is only going to Bihar for the opening day of the Assembly Session before coming to Bombay on the 8th. From this, it would appear that his agreeing to carry out your advice has not endured. I realise that this information will disappoint you.

When you come to Bombay, will you kindly bring with you the printed copy of the Appeal which was handed over to you by the appellants last November in Delhi as it should now be on the file as the official copy of the Appeal?

Incidentally, I have just received from Kalahandi a copy of a 'Personal and Confidential' letter written by him to Rajaji where he has expressed his unhappiness about discussions and decisions within the Parliamentary Group in regard to an amendment being moved to the Prime Minister's motion on the Colombo proposals and in regard to participation or otherwise in the Republic Day procession. This is between ourselves.
