My dear Rajaji,

It seems that Kamakhya Narayan Singh has not yet returned from abroad and so mercifully the registered letter I had sent on 16th November has been returned through the Post Office.

In view of what you told me in Poona, I am very glad that this particular letter has not reached Ramgarh and I am sending you a copy, so that you may be good enough to firm it up and not let it ~~give~~ ^{give} the impression that there is weakening in comparison with the resolution of July 22 adopted in Madras, of which also a copy is attached. I may mention that the minutes of the meeting of the Organisation Sub-Committee in Delhi on November 7 has however been posted to Ramgarh since he is a member. The attached extract reads as follows:-

"It was decided that no action be taken in regard to the developments in connection with the Madras resolution on Party organisation in Bihar until the President of the Bihar State Unit had returned to India and had communicated with the Party. Another meeting of the Organisation Sub-Committee should thereafter be called in Madras as early as possible, at which developments arising out of the resolution of July 22 up to that date would be reviewed."

This I am afraid I agreed to under pressure from Munshi. I am mentioning this, so that you may keep it in mind while redrafting my letter to Ramgarh.

I shall be most grateful to have the redraft of the letter so that I may post it to Ramgarh as soon as I learn of his return to India.

I trust you had a satisfactory journey back to Madras from Poona. It was a pleasure to see you and to compare notes.
