Your telegram of 12th. As you might have anticipated, I am deeply pained by its tone and purport.

Since the cause is too dear to expose it to such threatened surgery, I yield.

It was not my intention to let the decision go unexecuted. It was my intention to bring Munshi round in due time. His last letter was indicative of serious ill-health. However in view of what you have written and wired, I have written to him

Mr Ramachandra Reddy
phoned me yesterday from
Chittoor requesting non-release
of Madras decision until the
counting of votes in Chittoor
election will be over. Perhaps
you will not insist on the pound
of flesh and ask for release on
26th the day after the polling is over
but can allow it to lie over till
30th August. When the counting
will be over and results declared.

I note that you have discussed
the Madras resolution with Mr Bakshi
It cannot therefore long remain undis-
closed.
