My dear Rajaji,

I am anxious to know how you are doing, because I learnt that you were not quite well.

I had intended to come to Bangalore, but my health has become so brittle that the slightest strain, particularly of any journey or of long discussions, brings about an immediate setback. I am therefore not coming to Bangalore.

As I am not coming to Bangalore, I should like to place my views before you in connection with the Ramgarh affair. Masani has set out our case in a note, which has my approval.

Ramgarh has taken a very obstructive attitude which, if we weaken, would involve us into a lengthy litigation. In my opinion, we should refuse to get involved into further discussion and let things take their course.

I had also a talk with Raja of Maksudpur and made our position clear. It is for Ramgarh, in the first instance, to put himself right by carrying out the assurances which he had given earlier, making it ~~for~~ possible for us to respond. Anything else would create difficulties for us.
