My dear Rajaji,

* Our discussions have been proceeding and I enclose herewith a copy of the Draft as it has now shaped. It has been improved in one or two aspects and also, I am afraid, somewhat diluted. This was to be expected.

I am glad however that I was able very firmly to withstand pressure to agree to two topics being mentioned viz., Kashmir and the Nuclear Bomb, in a manner that was adverse to our point of view. Neither of these now figure in the Draft.

The ball is not now in our court. Let us see what the Congress Working Committee and the AICC decide when they meet in Bombay in the last week of this month. I shall be in Delhi on the 29th, immediately after those meetings, for a meeting of the Consultative Committee for the Ministry of External Affairs and will have another discussion with our friends. If there are any thoughts that you would like to share with me before I leave for Delhi on the 29th, do please let me have them.

As you must have seen from a telegram that Cooper has sent you, there has been a shift in the dates of our meetings in Madras which have now been fixed for the 20th, 21st and 22nd of July in deference to the wishes of our Andhra colleagues and Mr. & Mrs. Lobo Prabhu.
