Draft Minutes of the meeting of the Central Parliamentary Board held in New Delhi on November 5, 1966.

The Minutes of the last meeting held in Madras on July 22 and 23, 1966, were confirmed.

The business before the current Session of Parliament was discussed. In this connection the attention of the Board was drawn to a report that Sardar Buta Singh, an associate member of the Party's group in the Lok Sabha, had joined the Congress. It noted a letter written in this connection by the Secretary of the Akali Dal (Tara Singh group) to the effect that Sardar Buta Singh was violating a solemn agreement between the Party and the Akali Dal and in the circumstances the best thing would be for Sardar Buta Singh to tender his resignation from Parliament.

On the question of banning cow slaughter, the Board after discussion took the decision that the Party supported its banning within the framework of the law. It agreed that the ban should be extended to those States where it had not yet been banned.

The Board reviewed the progress made by the Party's prospective Parliamentary candidates so far nominated. A tabulated statement on candidates and constituencies was placed before the Board (copy attached). Annexure A.

The Board expressed its dissatisfaction with the pace of nomination of candidates to Parliament and State Assemblies. It called upon State Units to expedite the process of recommendations and assured in its turn that the Central Office and Parliamentary Board would expeditiously give its approval to recommendations made in the manner required. The Board hoped that the bulk of nominations would come in before the National Convention met in December. It fixed 10th as the last date for the purpose.

A letter from the Madras Shareholders Association calling for a ban on the contribution by companies to political parties was noted. The General Secretary was asked to write to them pointing out that the Swatantra Party had been the first to ask for such a ban.

A letter from the Catholic Association calling upon the Party to put up as many Christian candidates as possible was recorded.

The Board then took up for consideration recommendations of prospective Parliamentary and Assembly candidates and took the following decisions:

2. Pali - The Board, on the recommendation of the State Parliamentary Board withdrew its earlier approval of Mr. Chiman Singh Chanoud's candidature, and approved his replacement by Mr. S.K. Tapuria as the Party's candidate on a self-supporting basis.
3. Jalore - Mr. D.M. Patodia as the Party's candidate on a self-supporting basis.
4. Nagaur - Mr. N.K. Somani. While the Board would prefer Mr. Somani to be the Party's candidate on a self-supporting basis, it authorised the State Parliamentary Board, if it found necessary to permit him to stand as an independent provided
 - a. he accepts the Swatantra symbol;
 - b. he accepts the Swatantra Party's candidates for the Assembly constituencies within the constituency except in those two constituencies which have been conceded to the Jan Sangh as a result of electoral adjustment to which he should adhere, and
 - c. he agrees to finance his own election as also that of the Swatantra Party's Assembly candidates within his parliamentary constituency.

- In the light of recent development requiring reconsideration of previous decisions the General Secretary and the Joint Secretary were authorised, on the recommendation of the State President to give approval to such candidates for Parliament and State Assembly within this Parliamentary constituency as they might consider suitable.

Having considered Rajaji's letter to the President, the Parliamentary Board came to the conclusion that the General Secretary of the Party should be requested not to seek nomination for election next February so that he may not be pinned down to a constituency but be free to remain in charge of the Party's election campaign and organisation and to tour the country and be of assistance to State units and the Party's candidates, which which work he cannot be spared. Mr. Masani agreed to the Board's request.

In so far as the Rajkot Parliamentary Constituency was concerned, the Central Parliamentary Board requested Mr. Dahyabhai Patel, as suggested by Rajaji, to stand for election from Rajkot and Mr. Dahyabhai Patel agreed to respond to this request. The representatives from Gujarat present at the meeting, Mr. H.M. Patel and Mr. Vadilal Lallubhai, agreed to both the proposals.

The Committee endorsed Rajaji's hope that it would be found possible for Mr. Masani to be put up for election to the Lok Sabha as soon after the General Elections as possible and also decided that the position of Deputy Leader in the Lok Sabha should not be filled till Mr. Masani was re-elected to Parliament.

The Board reviewed the progress made in negotiating electoral adjustments with democratic opposition parties in the different States.

Gujarat:

The agreements arrived at with the Jan Sangh and the Republican Parties in the State were approved.

The agreement arrived at with the Jan Sangh was approved.

Uttar Pradesh:

The Board noted with regret that it had not been found possible to conclude a satisfactory agreement with the Jan Sangh.

Orissa:

The Board learnt with regret that the talks for an electoral arrangement with the Jana Congress had failed. While deploring this development, the Central Parliamentary Board had no other option but to ask the Orissa State Unit to go it alone and work for a Swatantra majority.

In view of the failure of the talks, the Board agreed that whatever tentative ~~commitments~~ has so far been made need no longer be considered binding.

The President of the State Unit, may, however, agree to resume the talks if approached by the Jana Congress.

The meeting then terminated.
