Education: Was educated at the Fergusson College, Poona,
from 1918 to 1921.

Joined the Cambridge University in 1922. Studied
History, Economics and Politics. Took Economics
Tripos Part I in 1924 and Economics Tripos Part
II in 1925.

Was admitted as a Fellow of the Royal Economic
Society, London, in 1925.

Was called to the Bar in 1926.

Experience: Was enrolled as an Advocate (Original Side) of
the Bombay High Court and of the Nagpur High
Court in 1927.

Practised as an Advocate in the Central Provinces
and Berar from 1928 to 1930.

Started Practise as an Advocate in the Bombay
Presidency in 1930.

Was appointed as the District Government Pleader
and Public Prosecutor for the District of East
Khandesh in February 1933 and worked continuously
in that capacity till the end of 1945, when I
resigned to be able to devote more time for public
work.

Was a Member of the Bombay Bar Council - 1941 to
1943.

Public Activities:

1. Was President of the Shri Shivaji Maratha
Boarding and of the Agriculturist Association
& Gram Sudharna Mandal at Yeotmal from 1927 to
1930.
2. Was elected to the Bombay Legislative Council
in 1930.

Was Member of the Public Accounts Committee of
the Bombay Legislative Council from 1931 to 36.

Was Member of the District School Board and of
the Municipal Borough, Jalgaon, from 1931 to 35.

Introduced the Debt-Conciliation Boards Bill in
the Bombay Legislative Council in 1935-36.

Was selected in 1937 as a member of a special
Committee of two members of the Legislative
Council to visit C.P. & Berar and the Punjab
and to report on the working of the Debt Adjust-
ment Boards in those Provinces.

3. Was elected to the Bombay Legislative Assembly
in February 1937.

Was the President of the Depressed Classes (Harijan) Boarding at Jalgaon from 1937 to 40.

Was the President of the Shikshanottejak Mandal (Sagar High School), Jalgaon.

Was the Founder President for 12 Years upto 1957 of the Khandesh College Education Society, Jalgaon, which started the Moolji Jaitha Arts & Science College in 1945.

Introduced rationing of Sugar and foodgrains throughout the East Khandesh District in October 1942 i.e. before it was introduced anywhere else in India.

Was Chairman of the District National Savings Committee, East Khandesh and a member of the Provincial National Savings Committee, Bombay Province.

Was the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Great Social Life and General Assurance Co. Ltd., Bombay, Continental Mutual Assurance Co. Ltd., Poona, and other business concerns for many years.

4. Was elected to the Bombay Legislative Assembly in 1951.

Was the Liquidator of the Fortune Commercial Bank Ltd., Jalgaon from 1951 to 1953.

Was appointed by the Government of India as the Regional National Savings Officer for Bombay State, Saurashtra and Kutch in 1955 from which post I retired in 1957.

Was elected to the Estimates Committee of the Bombay Legislative Assembly in 1954.

Was elected to the Court of Poona University by the Municipalities in East Khandesh District in 1953, 1958 and in 1963.

Was appointed as a Director of the East Khandesh Central Cooperative Bank Ltd., Jalgaon in 1955.

Is a member of the Managing Committee of the Women's Training College and Modern Girls' High School, Jalgaon since 1945.

Is a member of the "Government Diploma in Cooperation and Accountancy" Board.

Is a 'Nominee' of the Registrar of Cooperative Societies for Bombay City and Jalgaon District.

Is the General Secretary of the Swatantra Party, Maharashtra Region, since June 1962.

V. The present pattern of contesting the various Assembly Constituencies with Adjustments with other democratic opposition parties.

Out of the Assembly Constituencies, the Swatantra Party will contest two seats and the remaining four would be divided among P.S.P. and Jansangh and other parties. As far as the Parliamentary constituency is concerned, a promise has been obtained from other opposition parties that they would not put up any of their candidate and would support Mr. Patil's candidature. But no decision has yet been arrived at with the other parties as regards which Assembly seats would be contested by which Party.

VI. Reasons why the State Parliamentary Board considers it worthwhile to contest this Parliamentary constituency

Political record of the candidate.

The Candidate's suitability for and acceptability to the Constituency.

The attached cyclostyled copy giving particulars concerning Shri V. N. Patil's candidature shows that he is well qualified and he has three times successfully fought elections to the Bombay Legislature since 1930, when the whole District was one single constituency. In 1962, he contested this very parliamentary constituency as an independent supported by Jan Sangh. He decided to contest at the last moment without any serious preparation and could tour the constituency only for about a fortnight and that too with slender equipment. He had a rival from one of the Opposition parties. Even then, he secured about 60,000 votes. This time all the factors are favourable to him. He will have a long time before him to nurse his constituency with better equipment. The Opposition parties have promised to support him. The Congress is now far from popular. Congress may change their candidate next time and it may be worse for them.

Mr. Patil hails from the Agricultural communities -Maratas and allied castes-who are predominant in the constituency.

Mr. Patil's educational qualifications, his long experience and his varied public activities given in the cyclostyled copy attached herewith, show that he is a fit candidate for the Buldana Parliamentary constituency.

He is the General Secretary of the Swatantra Party, Maharashtra Region since 1962 and also the President of the local District Committee.

With only a Congress candidate to contest the Parliamentary constituency and with two Swatantra Candidates for the included Assembly constituencies and with the other democratic Opposition parties supporting Mr. Patil, he has a fighting chance of winning through.
