General Secretary's Report on Party Organisation
(with specific reference to the General Elections
and our own Party Elections)

On February 13, 1965, the General Council endorsed the proposals contained in the Statement on Organisation prepared by General Secretary.

2. GENERAL ELECTIONS

In that Note, the following targets had been set for achievement by the Party in the General Elections of 1967:

- a. Wiping out, in collaboration with other democratic Parties, the Congress majority in the Lok Sabha by carrying a large number of seats for the Swatantra Party.
- b. Eliminating the Congress majorities and establishing Swatantra (or Swatantra-led) Governments in Orissa, Rajasthan and Gujarat;
- c. Becoming the principal Opposition in some States, and increasing our strength in others.

3. On March 1, 1967, soon after the General Elections, the National Executive considered the Party's performance and came to the conclusion that it was far from satisfactory.

a. In collaboration with other Parties, though not to the extent that we had hoped for, we were able to bring the Congress Party to the brink of total defeat but not enough to push it over. Though we doubled our Lok Sabha strength from 22 to 44, we failed to get as little as the nine more seats that were required to entitle us to be the Official Opposition in the Lok Sabha. However, a point that ought to be noted here is that although we set up fewer candidates in 1967 than in 1962, we achieved a greater measure of success; (as against 192 candidates in 1962 returning 22 members, we set up 175 this time returning 44). Another interesting feature of the Lok Sabha results was that the composition in the last Lok Sabha was confined generally (with the exception of Andhra) to the States above the Vindhyas, while Southern States like Madras, Mysore were totally unrepresented. This time, however, both these States are well represented. On the other hand, we have been wiped out of Bihar and Punjab; and just one member was returned from U.P.

b. While we have not been able to set up a purely Swatantra Government in any State, we were able to eliminate the Congress majority in Orissa and to form a Swatantra-led Government in coalition with the Jana Congress. In Gujarat, although our increase in strength was spectacular (from just 26 members to 66), we were still not able to deprive the Congress of its majority. Moreover, due to post election defections (four defected and one unseated in an election petition) our strength in the legislature of that State has been eroded from 66 to 61. In Rajasthan, where we had come to an understanding with both the Jan Sangh and the Janta Party (dissident Congressmen), we were able to win 48 of the 107 seats we contested. Here too we were unable to deprive the Congress of its majority. The increase of our strength in the State Assembly was more modest - from 36 to 48; but post-election defections have drastically eroded our numbers from 48 to 35.

c. Andhra alone achieved the third target by moving into the position of the leading Opposition Group in the State Assembly. Since the elections, as a result of an arrangement with a group of dissident Congressmen, our

leader in the Andhra Assembly, Mr. G. Lathanna, is the leader of the Official Opposition. Our last target was to try and improve our position in the Legislatures of States where we had little or no strength. Madras and Mysore fulfilled this target by increasing their strength from 6 to 20 and 9 to 12 respectively. We entered for the first time the State Legislatures of Assam and Bengal with two and one members respectively.

4. Attached to this Report are two tabulated Statements which I would like our members to peruse carefully, and to note particularly the high proportion of those who lost their deposits in the General Election. Of the 175 candidates set up for the Lok Sabha, as many as one-half (86) lost their security deposits; and of the 973 candidates for the State Assemblies, as many as three out of every eight (367) lost their deposits. This is a clear indication of the fact that in nominating the Party's candidates there was lacking that careful scrutiny of the candidates' merits and prospects which such nominations should have received. The mistakes we committed in 1962 appear to have been repeated in 1967, especially the practice of last minute candidatures.

5. At its March meeting referred to earlier, the National Executive ascribed several reasons for our undoubtedly poor performance. They were:

- a. wrong choice of candidates, many of whom were nominated at the last moment;
- b. failure to arrive at electoral understandings in certain States; and also the unsatisfactory working of such understanding in some other States;
- c. bad management, especially in certain States, where the Party had legitimately hoped to do particularly well;
- d. the fact that almost every responsible national leader and office bearer was himself a candidate, thus leaving the campaign leaderless; and
- e. the absence of disciplined cadre of workers and of a Youth Wing.

6. There has been a rash of "floor-crossing" since the last General Elections. While we are not concerned with the reasons for Legislators of other Parties crossing floors, it is certainly necessary for us to examine the reasons why our Legislators deserted the Party especially in Rajasthan and Gujarat. In Rajasthan, the State Executive Committee at its meeting on August 1, 1967, while condemning its turncoat legislators, by implication admitted that not enough care had been taken in the nomination of candidates when it resolved that "as far as possible, only those workers of the Party who have been its members since a long period, should, in future, be set up as the Party's candidates for elections."

In Gujarat, perhaps the fact that our Party was not able to form a Government after all must have had something to do with four legislators crossing over to the Congress Party.

7. The foregoing does not, of course, claim to be an analysis of our performance in depth. In fact, it must be confessed that neither at the Centre nor at the State level has any serious attempt been made to analyse and consider the Party's performance. Such an analysis will have to be undertaken before long, not for its own sake, but as a guide to future course of action both organisationally as well as from the specific stand-point of making a decisively better showing at the next General Elections.

8. The New National Executive should, I suggest, appoint a Sub-Committee to study the Party's performance both in respect of the elections to the Lok Sabha and the State Assemblies. I feel sure that State Units will extend their fullest cooperation to such a Sub-Committee in order that it may fruitfully undertake such a post-mortem investigation.

9. PARTY ELECTIONS

Party elections began in August this year and will culminate with the election of the Office Bearers and the New National Executive at this meeting of the General Council. This affords a good opportunity briefly to run through a few salient features concerning the present anatomy of the Party:-

a. Increase In Membership

Party membership has certainly leaped from 25,852 in July 1964 to 47,151 in June 1967. The following is the State-wise break-up of current membership:

b. New Blood

A preliminary study of the Office-Bearers of new State Executives indicates that there is a welcome entry of new blood in more than half the State Units where elections were contested. For instance, Andhra, Bombay City, Gujarat, Orissa, and Rajasthan all have new General Secretaries while Gujarat and Kerala have new Presidents. This General Council itself has a plentiful supply of new blood, - 97 of the 170 elected members being new. I attach for the information of members, lists of Office Bearers of State Units and members of the present General Council.

c. Rank and File

Another interesting development has been the increasing sense of participation and the alertness of the Party's rank and file. This again is a good pointer. It is to be hoped that this will help the Party's organisation to become more active and also stronger in terms of cadres needed to spread the Party's message over wider areas.

d. Unorganised States

On the other hand, I must regretfully state that the Party still remains unorganised in sizeable areas in the country where due to poor enrolment or none at all, we were unable to hold Party elections. These are the States of Assam, Bihar, Haryana, Himachal

Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and West Bengal. The New National Executive will have to take steps to develop the Party in these unorganised States if we are to justify our claims to be a National Party.

e. Conduct of Elections

On the whole, the Party elections have been remarkably well conducted, though there were a few instances of breach of rules. Appropriate action has been taken or initiated in such cases. At this point, it is perhaps pertinent to say, with great respect, that our Constitution, and such Rules as have been framed thereunder, are rather sketchy and need revision in some directions. These deficiencies will have to be carefully considered and rectified by the new National Executive at an early date.
