Your Highness,

May I avail this privilege of writing to Your Highness though uncertain of the fate this letter meets for none of my letters have been acknowledged.

A week back, Mr. Shri Ram, M.L.A., from Kotputali has crossed the floor. Many of our M.L.A.'s have changed the colour. The problem may annoy Your Highness now but a commoner like me has always expected it.

The party affairs are getting worse in Rajasthan. We had a crushing defeat at the hands of Sukhadia. Should we not initiate the process of self-searching criticism? May I point out the following mistakes:
