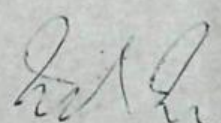
In so far as the Unit Trust scheme is concerned, I do not think it will be possible to argue that it in any way replaces the Compulsory Deposit Scheme since it is altogether on a voluntary basis, and only a handful of people may be expected to participate in it.
