My dear Prof. Ranga,

I was pleased to receive your letter and glad to hear that the Maharaja of Baria has started working in Madhya Pradesh. He had discussed it with me and I think he can do quite well in that area.

It is really very difficult to know what to do about Kashmir issue. I personally feel that the public should be educated in the right way. Though, of course, if the Party loses popularity it will be very difficult to influence anyone.

I have met a very interesting person here who is fighting Communism. He is a Hungarian by origin and I hope to bring back some literature which he is publishing.

I don't know what you mean by saying that our membership campaign is not gaining momentum. Is it because our members are not doing anything about enrolling others, or is it because nobody wishes to join our Party!

Prithviraj is over here on business, but he will be returning to India soon, and I am sending this letter with him.

In Calcutta the people who work in the Swatantra Forum are extremely intelligent and well-informed, but I am not sure whether they are real workers and would be able to gain the sympathy and confidence of the rural people, who, after all, are in the majority in our country. I honestly feel that in Bengal six parliamentary constituencies should be chosen. Workers

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should be employed and the ground prepared for the 1967 elections. There is a Mrs. Ginwala, who is very interested in our Party and who is very well off and may be able to help with funds. I have introduced her to Nandi Babu and he can put you in touch with her. If we can only get six Jeeps, and if we can afford to pay Rs.200 a month to six workers, I feel sure that we can capture quite a lot of legislative assembly seats in Calcutta, and also we may be able to return a few members of Parliament to the House from Bengal.

We are having a very nice time over here and hate the thought of having to return to India! When is the Parliament meeting?

I hope you and Mrs. Ranga are well.
