Bihar Swatantra leader surprised

PAT Aug. 10 (PTI)

Mr. Kanaiya Narain Singh, M.L.A., President, Bihar Swatantra Party and leader of the Opposition in the Bihar Assembly, yesterday expressed his "shock and surprise" at the decision of the organisational sub-committee of the Swatantra Party dissolving the interim executive committee and the Bihar organisation of the party.

Mr. Singh in a statement said, "It is all the more surprising that the decision has been taken when I was expecting a letter from Mr. K. M. Munshi about the contents of the allegations and the plan and time of the proposed enquiry."

Though Mr. Munshi had been authorised by the central organisational committee to enquire into certain complaints against the Bihar unit, "he wrote nothing to me about the enquiry," he added.

On the other hand, I had myself written to Mr. Munshi for information. In view of what has been stated I am not inclined to believe now a decision of such far-reaching consequence and which can lead to grave repercussions on the All-India party could have been taken without any enquiry whatsoever. My surprise is all the greater because the reported decision has been sent to the press before the party itself has been informed."

A campaign Committee started recently is busy collecting between 40,000 and 50,000 signatures for a petition urging the Federal Government to make a gift of one million tons of wheat to India. The committee says that the wheat should be diverted from Australia's exports to Communist China.

Mr. F. J. Mount is the chairman of the committee which includes Prof. Ray, Mr. Newman Resenthal, Dr. Vernon Rice and Dr. Frank Knopfmacher. The committee has already circulated the petition throughout Australia to be filled in over the next six weeks. In a statement the committee said that while India was experiencing acute food shortage and urgently needed assistance, Australia was selling wheat to Communist China at drastically reduced rates.
