Minutes of the Meeting of the Parliamentary Board
held in Bombay at the residence of Sir Homi Mody,
1 Cammichael Road, Bombay 26, on Sept. 30, at 10:30 a.m.

The minutes of the meeting held in New Delhi on
September 16 were approved and confirmed.

The Board then took up for consideration recommendations
received from various State Units in regard to the nominations
of prospective Parliamentary candidates for the 1967 elections.
The Board decided that, out of the names so recommended, the
following should be approved :

U.P. - Smt. Basant Kunwar Bai : Kaiserganj
Rao Krishnapal Singh : Jaleshwar
Orissa - Mr. P. K. Deo : Kalandi

In so far as the other names submitted by the Orissa
and U.P. Units were concerned, the Parliamentary Board authorised
the President and General Secretary to examine the proposals
and to make suitable recommendations at the next meeting of the
Board.

The General Secretary then reported on the meeting of
representatives of various Parties and groups convened by the
Election Commission on September 12, 1964, in New Delhi. The
Board requested Mr. K. M. Munshi to draft a memorandum to the
Election Commission on the various issues raised at the meeting
on September 12 and the General Secretary was requested to
finalise the draft in consultation with the President, Rajaji
and Mr. Munshi and forward it to the Election Commission.

The resignation of Mr. Yashpal Singh, M.P. from the
Party's Group in Parliament was then considered after the
General Secretary had reported on the circumstances leading to
his resignation as a result of Mr. Yashpal Singh's dissatis-
faction with the seating arrangements decided upon by the
Party's group. Mr. Yashpal Singh's resignation was accepted.

Prof. Ranga then reported on the circumstances leading
to his signing a joint letter to the President of India call-
ing for the removal from office of Mr. Sanjiva Reddy, Union
Minister for Heavy Industries.

The meeting then terminated.
