The minutes of the last meeting held on May 17, 1964, were approved and confirmed.

2. Arising out of the minutes, the position in Kerala was discussed. The General Secretary reported on his correspondence with Mr. V. P. Menon and the Zonal Convenors of the Party in Kerala.

He ~~reported on~~ the talk he had with Mr. V. P. Menon on the telephone at Bangalore and conveyed Mr. Menon's advice that the question of a decision on the Party's future set-up in Kerala be postponed to enable him to meet Mr. Raghava Menon.

Later, the General Secretaries of the Central and Southern Zonal Units of the Party in Kerala were called in to express their view of the Party's present position in Kerala and what they felt were the reasons which encouraged their belief that the Party could fight the forthcoming elections.

In the light of Mr. Menon's advice and other considerations, the Sub-Committee took the following decision:

'The President and General Secretary of the Party and Mr. V. P. Menon are authorised to investigate the Party's future set up in Kerala, including the advisability of contesting the Assembly elections in 1965 and to report to the Organisation Sub Committee.'

3. The General Secretary reported on the unfortunate state of affairs in the Party Unit in Delhi. After considerable discussion it was decided to recommend the following decision for adoption by the Central Organising Committee: 'In view of the prolonged and continuous failure of the Delhi Committee to function efficiently and in harmony, the Central Organising Committee decides that the Delhi Unit of the Party and the ad hoc Committee appointed by the Centre to conduct its affairs in Delhi be dissolved.

'The Central Organising Committee notes that efforts are being made by various members in unauthorised ways to enrol members in Delhi and it was, therefore, decided to announce that no members should be enrolled in Delhi and this should be made known to the public.

'Existing Life Members of the Party in Delhi will continue to be individual members, and individuals who wish to join the Party may do so by applying to the Central Office for application forms.'

4. A timetable of elections to Party Committees was approved for recommending to the Central Organising Committee.
5. The meeting then adjourned till the following day.

1. The Sub Committee considered developments in Bihar and the state of affairs in the Bihar Unit of the Party. In this connection, the unsatisfactory functioning of the Unit and its ad hoc Committee and complaints received from members of the Party in that State in regard to the unavailability of forms for the enrolment of Workers were reported to the Sub Committee.
