The General Secretary reported on his visit to U.P. in connection with the re-organisation of the State Committee. In view of the absence of unanimity and the fact that Mr. S.K.D. Paliwal was not present at the meeting in Lucknow on December 27, and that Mr. Raghavendra Pratap Singh was not available in Madras for consultations, it was decided that the General Secretary should discuss the matter with those two functionaries jointly at a meeting in Delhi at the end of this month and should report to the next meeting of the Organisation Sub-Committee or the Central Organising Committee.

The General Secretary further reported that the U.P. State Committee at the meeting at which he was present, had come to the conclusion that no question of merger with the Jan Singh in the U.P. Legislative Assembly arose as a result of the merger of the P.S.P. and S.P. in the State Assembly. The Sub-Committee concurred in this view of the U.P. unit.

At the President's suggestion, it was agreed that liberty should be given to reconstituted State Executive Committees to co-opt five more members in addition to those approved by the Centre, wherever this was found necessary in order to give representation to elements that had remained unrepresented.

At Mr. Munshi's instance it was agreed that, in addition to State Executive Committees, State units should be permitted to recommend to the C.O.C. the constitution of State Councils consisting of a larger number of members. Such councils should, in addition to the members of the State Executive Committee, including sitting members of Parliament and the State Assembly as also defeated candidates for Parliament and the Assembly in appropriate cases.

Arising from the minutes of the last meeting, the Organisation Sub-Committee reviewed the developments in Bihar since its meeting in July, 1962, including the non-compliance with the resolution of the Joint Meeting of the Organisation Sub-Committee and the Parliamentary Board in July and an Appeal to the General Council of the Party that had been made through the President of the Party by some members of the Bihar State unit, copies of which had been printed and evidently widely distributed. The Sub-Committee noted that this appeal repeated several of the aspersions contained in the State President's report which was the subject matter of the resolution of July 22 and further that the statements made in the appeal are slanderous and carry implications which would seriously affect the Party's position in the country.

With reference to a telegram that had been received from the Bihar State President stating that, as no intimation had been received from the Central Office, he had refrained from proceeding to Madras, the General Secretary reported on his letter to the Bihar State President of December 24 asking him to confirm that he was back in India so that the Organisation Sub-Committee could meet at an early date in Madras when he could be

present and at which developments arising out of the resolution of July 22 could be reviewed, and the Bihar State President's reply of December 28 acknowledging receipt of that letter. The General Secretary further reported that notices of the Parliamentary Board and the Organisation Sub-Committee meetings in Madras had been issued to Mr. Kamakhya Narain Singh as to other members and that, indeed, two copies of the notices were sent, one to his residence in Patna and the other to the Party office in Patna, by way of greater caution.

The correspondence that had taken place recently between the Bihar State President and Rajaji was also taken note of by the Sub-Committee.

After discussion, it was decided that, since the new State Executive Committee appointed by the resolution of July 22 had not been allowed to function and the competence of the Organisation Sub-Committee had been challenged in the Appeal made to the General Council, the entire matter should be reported to the General Council for its decision at an early meeting.

It was decided that the Central Organising Committee should meet in Bombay on Saturday, February 9 and the General Council on Sunday, February 10. Other appropriate business may also be placed on the agenda of these meetings.

Copies of the text of the Appeal to the General Council and of a statement to be prepared by the General Secretary relating the facts and correcting the misstatements contained in the Appeal should be sent by the Central Office to members of the General Council in advance of the meeting.

The Organisation Sub-Committee decided to submit to the C.O.C. a report on the question.

The meeting then terminated.
