My dear Masani,

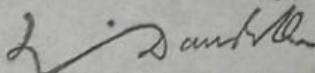
The Central Parliamentary Board and the National Executive at their meetings held in New Delhi on April 13 and 14, considered your letter of resignation from these two bodies. I also read out to both these bodies the text of your letter dated 10th April to the President, Prof. Ranga, declining his invitation to be present at those two meetings. In doing so, I emphasised your reiteration not to withdraw your resignation.

Both the Board and the Executive however unanimously requested that you should withdraw your resignation. They felt that in view of disciplinary action having been initiated against Mahida and the five persons who are known to have supported his candidature, there remained no further cause for such a drastic act of atonement by you; and that you should be requested to reconsider your resolve not to withdraw your resignation.

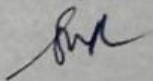
I trust in view of this unanimous request you will reconsider the matter.
