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Day results were announced - December 4, 1945.

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Interviewed by a representative of the 'Times of India', MRM said: "Bombay has again vindicated its political sagacity by voting for the Congress. It was a clean contest, but not a hard one. Mr. Dhandhare put up a good fight, but both the facts of the situation and the feelings of the ~~people~~ public were against him. The election results from other places and provinces underline the same moral, that the country as a whole, looks to the Congress alone to enforce the national demand."

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
