Your letter.

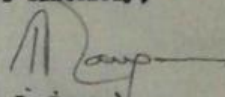
As I have already told you, it is not the function of the Parliamentary Group of our Party to sit in judgment over the decisions of the National Executive. At best, it can only offer a suggestion or make a recommendation on any such matter as is referred to in your letter, before the National Executive takes a decision. Since the National Executive has already expelled Shri C.C.Desai, I am sorry, I cannot place this matter before the Parliamentary Party.

Regarding your proposal to move a 'No Confidence Motion', that can be entertained either by the National Executive or the General Council, as the case may be, on proper notice etc. The Parliamentary Group cannot be expected to consider such extreme matters.

Whatever has been done by Mr. Masani, in regard to this matter, was done in his capacity as the President of the National Party and through the National Executive. Therefore, the Parliamentary Group cannot consider this matter.

I have already conveyed the substance of these points to you when you talked to me about your intentions.
