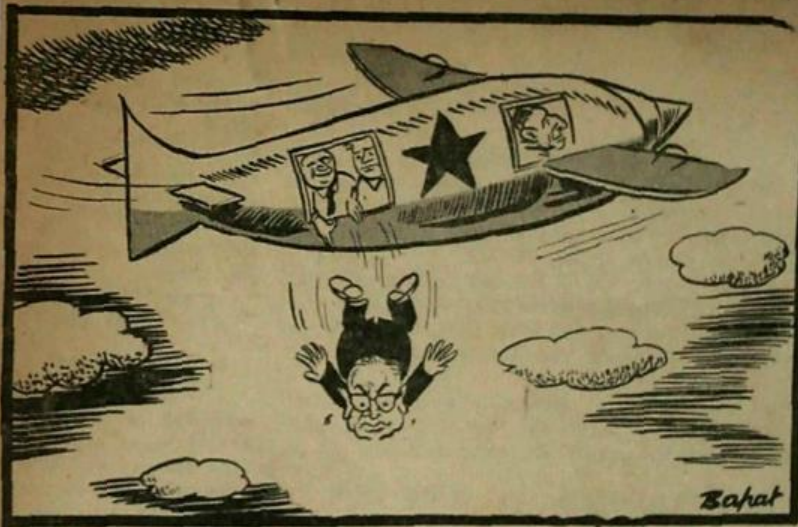

2 killed, 47 hurt in bus smash

NEW DELHI, April 13.

Two persons, a 15-year-old boy and a 35-year-old labourer, were killed and 47 others injured when a Haryana Roadways bus bound for Delhi smashed against a tree and overturned near Mundka village in Nangloi this morning.

Forty-one of the injured have been admitted to Irwin and Willingdon hospitals. They include seven women and four children. The condition of some of them, including the driver, is said to be causing anxiety.

It is reported that the bus left Beri village in Rohtak district for Delhi at about 7.30 a.m. There were about 55 passengers on board (the exact number could not be ascertained till late at night).

According to the police, the bus was near Mundka village, two miles from Nangloi, when it swerved to the left, smashed against a tree, overturned and fell into a ditch. Due to the impact of the accident, the emergency exit of the bus got jammed, trapping all passengers.

Alarm raised

Minutes after the accident a traffic inspector of the Delhi Transport Undertaking, who was passing by that way, heard people screaming for help. He raised an alarm and collected some villagers. They broke window panes and pulled out the victims. Meanwhile, some one informed the police.

trol room and ambulance vans also reached the scene.

According to Mr Bhanot, the bodies of Mr Vijay Kumar, 15, and Chander, 35, who died on the spot, were pulled out from the fallen bus.

Forty-seven persons—36 men, seven women and four children—were injured. Thirty-one of the injured were admitted to Irwin Hospital and five to Willingdon Hospital. Six others, who were taken to the police hospital, were discharged after first aid.

The condition of some of the passengers, including the driver, Mr Bhagwan Singh, is reported to be serious. The driver is reported to have fractured both legs.

Miraculous escape

Among the six persons who had a miraculous escape was a six-month-old child who was found sandwiched between a cotton bundle and a blanket. The mother of the child is among the seriously injured.

An assistant sub-inspector of Delhi police is among the victims admitted to hospital.

According to some villagers, the driver of the bus swerved and braked the bus in a bid to save a child crossing the road. But the bus swerved too much to the left and smashed against a tree.

Mr Bhanot, however, said there were no tyre marks on the road which could lead him to believe that the driver had suddenly applied the brakes in his attempt to save the

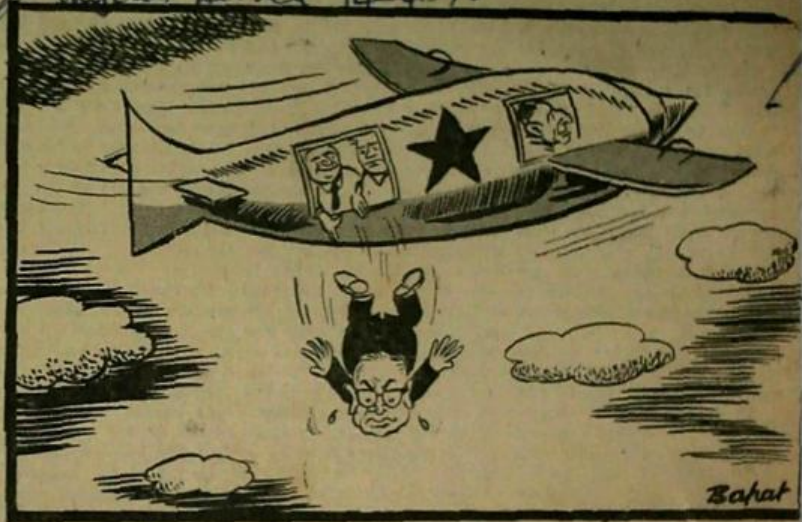

to be given a chance in business management, it is necessary that they compete with the "establishment" on fairer terms.
