NATIONAL PARTY OF INDIA

"Good living, next to freedom, is our birthright".

India is a great country with vast natural resources, fertile soil, all the industries and intelligent people, yet the poverty, unemployment, food and housing shortages are worse than in any other country.

The object of the National Party of India is to provide each family with a two-room accommodation and a minimum income of Rs. 500/- per month for each earning member.

To start with, this National Party of India calls upon the present Ruling Parties at the Centre and the States to bring about the following basic reforms during their current term, failing which this Party shall contest the next elections, get itself in power in the Parliament and the State Legislatures and shall, within five years, implement these reforms :

1. Further growth in population has to be arrested at any cost as a top priority welfare measure to improve the standard of living of the people. The Parliament or all the State Legislatures shall immediately introduce compulsory sterilisation for every married man after he has had three children, as attempted by the Bill No. XXV of 1976 dated 30th March, 1976, passed with amendments by the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly and Council.

2. For national integration and unity among the people of India --

(a) The existing State boundaries shall be eliminated and India shall be divided into five Zones. The first dividing line shall be drawn at 78° longitude starting from the North and ending at 16° latitude near Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh, and the other two dividing lines shall be at 24° and 16° latitudes. The Parliament and the offices of the Central Government shall be shifted to Hyderabad. Madras shall be the capital for the South Zone, Bombay for the West Zone, Calcutta for the East Zone and Delhi for both the North-East and North-West Zones. Each existing District shall have its own municipality and Courts. Each Zonal capital shall have a division of the Supreme Court of India dealing exclusively with constitutional matters.

(b) All regional languages shall be discontinued and, within five years, replaced by Hindi and English for all purposes throughout India ; and,

(c) A uniform, comprehensive and consolidated Code of Morals and Ethics, containing the essence of all religions, shall be compiled within a period of five years and its teachings imparted in all places of worship and schools.

3. Wealth acquired through corruption, dishonesty and other anti-social activities like hoarding, black-marketing, smuggling and tax-evasion, enables a man and his family members to lead undesirable living against the larger interest of the public. To improve the moral fibre of the country, all members of the family of the offender enjoying the ill-gotten gains shall also, on principle of collective responsibility, be prosecuted and punished and all their unaccounted properties shall be confiscated. To gear up the economy, no person shall hold gold beyond 100 grams for his/her personal use. Investment in diamonds, gold and silver is unproductive.

4. Justice delayed is justice denied. In case of any civil dispute, the plaintiff shall prepare and serve on the defendant his statement of claim, supported by xerox copies of the original documents relied upon and the sworn statements of his witnesses. The defendant shall similarly submit his written statement to the plaintiff within 15 days. The plaintiff may give his further reply within 7 days. Thereafter, the advocates of each party shall, within one month, write judgments on merits of law and facts based on the material before them and simultaneously place them before a bench of two judges of the Court of competent jurisdiction who shall pass separate orders and decrees at the first sitting without giving any reasons. In the event of any difference between the two judges, they shall themselves immediately place the papers before a single appellate judge who shall promptly confirm the order of one of the two judges. There shall be no oral evidence, cross-examination or arguments at any stage and there shall be no appeal. The Court fee on each case shall not exceed Rs. 250/-.

5. To have unhampered industrial production, strikes, go-slow and other labour agitations by the workers, amounting to taking law into their own hands and throttling the very organisations they serve, shall be banned. The workers' demands, if any, shall be settled by direct negotiations, conciliation, adjudication or arbitration. The existing labour legislation in this country fully protects the rights and interest of the workers. Workers could gradually become partners to the extent of 50 per cent in the industry by contributing a portion of their wages regularly towards share capital.

6. It shall be compulsory for every person between the age of 16 and 60 years to plant and sustain two trees bearing fruits like mangoes, apples, pears, peaches, oranges, guava, etc. The fruits shall belong to the person growing the trees and to his/her heirs. The country would thus have an addition of 100 crores of fruit-trees.

7. To encourage literacy and fight malnutrition among the poor children, schools shall provide one free meal and a quarter litre of milk to every student.
