I would urge you to do whatever you can because our Kerala boys as it is are feeling let down and this small bit of assistance might go a long way in reassuring them of our interest.

Due to the above reasons and

transferred now.

as personnel officer. He does not
know neither Hindi nor Marathi.
A personnel officer will not be able
to discharge his duties effectively
unless he knows the language of
the people working in the factory.
So professionally also he will not
be a success in a Bombay factory.
