Dear Sir,

I felt like a gun-shot at my heart as I heard from my radio at 8.45 p.m. on 4.4.71, that our god-like president Mr. Masani has submitted his resignation to the high command of our party. First I did not believe the fatal news and meanwhile imagined myself that I was really under some sort of hallucination or plunged in such day-dreams which always render their effect in reverse, under the shadow of my favourable thinking, that our president is not the man of so low appetite who may easily be tempted or forced to leave the chair or weak in his conscience mental energy and will-power that he may lose the balance of his mind in vain.
