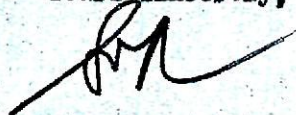
Dear Mr. Pandey,

This refers to your letter of August 11 to Mr. Masani who is presently abroad and will be back by the middle of October.

As regards your statement that your vote was immaterial, I differ with you and say that every vote is material. Today it can be said that fifty-three ideologically-committed members of the Party put up a fight and recorded their dissent to something that was very unworthy of the trust placed in those who have been put in positions of authority in the Party.
