My dear Piloo,

When you called to see me at my place on Saturday morning, you had expressed a wish that I should send you a draft resolution for possible presentation to the National Convention of the Party on August 4 and you had said that you would let me have your comments and suggestion in regard to the draft so that we may, as suggested in the last paragraph of my letter to you of July 1, perhaps be able to evolve a consensus.

I have put together a draft resolution, a copy of which I enclose. This is a tentative draft and we can certainly try to improve on it. I have carried out the thought that this facilitates the future activities, at different levels, of those holding conflicting views within our Party without making one look more legitimate than the other. At the same time, it is the essence of this draft that the Party as a going concern transmutes itself into a non-party organisation and that the question of its dissolution is dropped.

This line of thought I have advanced can only be given effect if both you on the one side and those who want to continue the party as a political party on the other are good enough to welcome and adjust themselves to this way out.

I shall await an early reply.
