My dear Rajarshi,

I have seen today your letters of the 7th, 10th and 16th June and copy of a telegram sent to Masani. This was because for the first time after the election result was announced I was for the last few days in my constituency to thank the voters. I am sending you herewith copies of two letters received from Masani. I do not know when it will be possible for you, Jai Prakash and Masani ^{and me} to meet together. Since the election result was out, I have sent copies of my speech at the Unity Conference and my explanation of the six points programme to Jai Prakash. There has been no answer to any of these letters. He is always on the move and I do not know how to contact him. Can you not place this burden of arranging a meeting between us four on Masani? He is more likely to get in touch with Jai Prakash than myself. I shall be available for a meeting at any time it is decided upon. I like

the idea of a preliminary meeting between us four. However, I do not know what will be ^{the} _L reaction of Ranga's to such a meeting. You will have to consider this and communicate your views to Masani.

As regards publication of my explanatory notes on the six-points of common programme, I have no objection to the whole article being cut ^{up} off. Only I would like to have a copy of the final shape of the different sections in which my article is divided. I hope this will be possible.
