It was only yesterday that I received your letter of August 27. While I am disappointed that you will not be with us in Parliament till the 21st, I am glad you will be back at the time when I expect to be in Delhi as there is so much to discuss with you both about affairs in Rajasthan and about the Party in general.

The Rajasthan Unit asked for my indulgence in agreeing to some extension of time for enrolment of workers and holding up elections. Quite apart from their own plea your absence from India was decisive in so far as I am concerned and I thought something was to be gained by holding things back till you are here. I have, therefore, told them to continue enrolling till the end of September and hold elections after the 15th of October by which time you will be back at headquarters.

I am glad to have an indication of your views in regard to Bihar. Rajaji too will be glad to know that you realise the need for firmness if the whole Party is not to go to pieces.

Shakuntala joins me in sending you our warm regards.
